

Thanks to an expanded staffing team and incredible volunteer support, more than 2,100 sessions were delivered across the season — creating opportunities for participants of all ages and abilities to get on the water, learn, and enjoy the sport.

- Schools Engagement a successful taster day with Fettes College, paving the way for future group sessions.

#### 2025 brought a full calendar of excitement:

- Town Loch Triple Trophy Scotland's first ranked three-event since 2009, reaffirming our place on the UK circuit.
- Scottish Waterski Festival an inclusive celebration of the season, held in September.
- Scottish Student Open uniting students and alumni from universities across Scotland for the first event of its kind.
- **Wee Board Bash** a team knee and wakeboarding event featuring first-time, developing, and elite riders.
- Backyard Waterski Series Town Loch proudly hosted 2 stops in this fun, community-driven competition.

The off-season jump renovation was a major highlight — enabling competitions, clinics, and regular sessions throughout the year.

The team also managed reduced water levels early in the season, adapting operations to keep members skiing safely while protecting boats and equipment.
